1. My name is upon the plaque. I died in about 1981. I am remembered for my Barbershop on South Main Street, which was called Brown's Barber Shop. I operated it for 40 years. I was a veteran of WWII and in life I lived on Pleasant Ave.

Now as you enter the cemetery stay to the section to the far right (33).

2. Can you find me? I was born in 1897 and am a female. About the time of my death someone planted a small pine tree near my headstone. Now, many years later, this little pine protects me, it is almost as if we have become one. My full name is on my small stone.

3. Once I was a brave soldier. I now lie beside my fellow military men around the flagpole. My rank was Sergeant First Class. I was born in 1917 and died in 1991. I wear my bravery on my stone; I received a Silver Star and a Purple Heart.

4. I am surrounded by family. My family helped build this area. There are still several of my descendants here including the Town Supervisor. I died tragically in 1934 at the young age of 47, from the effect of burns received when a gasoline stove which I was cleaning exploded. 5. I am female and have a small funeral home marker. I was born in California and came to Central Square in 1989. I will probably be remembered most for being a board member of the Oswego County Fair and a 4-H leader. I passed away in 2008 at the age of 48 years old.

6. My photo is upon my headstone. I died way too young just 18 days before my 21st birthday in an automobile accident. I graduated in 2004 from Paul V. Moore High School

7. Now can you find a stone with names on both side? If you look carefully you will find out the name of a man who is buried at Glenwood Cemetery in Watertown!

8. I died in 1946. My last name is that of a fish and my first name is quite common. My fathers name is the same as mine. He was a harness maker in Central Square. A fire began in his shop and burned down the entire building...which was located where the Goettel Block stands today.

9. Do not walk to quickly down the hill or you will miss my stone which is now hidden even though it is large. In 1900 I bought the milk route of Charles Blount. My first name is associated with a mine in New York State.
