To begin your History Hunt...Enter the Cemetery through the front gate (off Rt 11). As you enter can you find the answer to clue #1?

1. My name is upon the plaque. I died in about 1981. I am remembered for my Barbershop on South Main Street, which was called Brown's Barber Shop. I operated it for 40 years. I was a veteran of WWII and in life I lived on Pleasant Ave.

Stay to the right/1st North Avenue. You will see section 1

2. I was a sergeant in the Civil War. I was Justice of the Peace for the Town of Hastings for 22 years and lived on Mallory Street in Central Square. When I died (January 28, 1934) I was 89 years old. My headstone is very simple.

3. I was a veteran of the Civil War and one of the most prominent residents of Central Square. During the Civil war I was captured and held prisoner by the Confederates for 10 months. My stone is large and red in color. My wife, Catherine, was ill with pneumonia for only 36 hours before it caused her death in 1922.

4. Is there a doctor in the house? Yes, I was a doctor in Central Square. My headstone looks out of place and appears to be on a "sidewalk" within the cemetery. When I was 16 yrs. old I began teaching school. In 1882 when I was 20 yrs. old I studied medicine. In 1886 I graduated from University of Vermont Medical school. I also served as President of the Board of Education and in 1912 I helped organize First National Bank of Central Square. I was Vice President of the bank.

5. Look carefully for our stone...on it is an old mill and a tree. The top has an open book. You will find the following inscription if you look closely...."Time is time was time shall be no more".

6. My headstone faces Route 11. My wife Nancy is at my side. I was born in 1825 and my death was not recorded on my stone. My father was Reverend Peter Woodin, founder and pastor of the Baptist Church in Central Square. I was a harness maker. In 1860 I went to California by sailing vessel, it took 4 months. I worked in the gold mines and lost a thumb and 2 fingers on my left hand.

7. I was born in Hamburg, Germany in 1892. I suffered for many years from a goiter. After undergoing surgery for it I passed away from pneumonia in 1935. I rest beside my husband who was a Corporal in World War I.

8. My headstone is a white Holy Bible. On the base is the inscription, "Earth has no sorrow that heaven cannot..." I died September 7, 1883

9. I was born in London, England. My saloon and hotel stood in the late 1800's and early 1900's where today's Traub Funeral home is. Later my establishment became more of a café. I am buried by the answer to #8 and my stone matches my wife, Eva's, stone.

10. At one time my family was very well known. My family was involved in Low's Cash Store in Central Square. It was located where the bookstore is today. We have a large family stone surrounded by our individual stones. I was born in 1874 and died in 1956. My wife, Cora and son Clyde are buried nearby.
