To begin your History Hunt...Enter the Cemetery through the front gate (off Rt 11). As you enter can you find the answer to clue #1?

1. My name is upon the plaque. I died in about 1981. I am remembered for my Barbershop on South Main Street, which was called Brown's Barber Shop. I operated it for 40 years. I was a veteran of WWII and in life I lived on Pleasant Ave.

Head up North Avenue to section 7 for your hike....and find....

2. I am the wife of Ephraim Fuller. I suffered for many months before my death on November 23, 1892 from complications of diseases. I was a teacher and all three of my daughters (Cora, Lizzie and Nellie) became teachers. My son, Granger (which was my maiden name) was a doctor. On my headstone it says Not lost only gone before,

3. I was born in Central Square in 1872 and died February 23, 1942. On June 29, 1900 I married the pastor (Reverend) from St. Lawrence County and in 1928 we moved to Cleveland, NY. My daughter name (Esther) is also on our stone. She was the wife of Ray Codner.

4. My stone is tall and hard to miss. I was born April 14, 1839 in West Monroe. As a boy I spent my days farming and making salt barrels. In April 1861 I enlisted in Co. D, 24th NY Volunteers and carried the first flag that was taken from this part of the country. I was injured severely during the war and laid on the battle field several days without food, water or help. I was then in the hospital for 8 months. I died January 12, 1918.

5. I lie beside my father and was a doctor. When my father died on January 12, 1918 I was the doctor who was at his side. I died shortly after my father in 1919. In September 1897, while targeting my gun, it burst and a portion of the hammer (about 1 inch in length) entered my skull just above my eye. Dr. Conterman operated without anesthesia and removed the piece of iron.

6. I was born in 1876 and died in 1940. For many years I operated a restaurant called the Franklin in Central Square. For 4 years I was postmaster but had to retire in 1938 because of my health. My wife's maiden name was Hamilton.

7. My stone is tall and white. I was only 35 years, 4 months and 1 day old when I passed away tragically. I died May 20, 1874 in a railroad accident at Brewerton. On my stone it reads...A husband and father gone and oh how we miss him. My last name is a place where people usually gather on Sundays.

8. I was born in Germany in 1823 and died in 1907. I came to Syracuse in 1851 and then Central Square in 1857. I was a cabinet maker and an undertaker. The funeral home on South Main Street still wears my last name. I was also the first Treasurer for the Village when it was incorporated in 1890. My wife and daughter are buried with me.

9. I served in the Civil War as a drummer in Company D. 110th Regiment NY Volunteers. When I was 6 years old my father died and I was adopted by Mr. North. We moved to Hastings. My family still lives in Hastings and Central Square. I died May 7, 1904 at about 85 years old. My family ran this cemetery for many years and you will see our names everywhere...our last name starts with the letter "P".
