Rules and Regulations

Brief History of the Cemetery

In 1822 the cemetery property was decided to the public by James I. Roosevelt. The first burial was that of Mrs. Anna Goodspeed who died on April 16th, 1822.

The cemetery was incorporated during the Civil War and named Hillside Cemetery Association by Mrs. Armonella Devendorf. Mrs. Devendorf, together with Mrs. G.T. Boynton and Mr. Lewis Fancher solicited funds in 1893 for the original receiving vault. The Vault is no longer in use, but still remains in good condition at the cemetery.

On January 1, 2000, the Hillside Cemetery Association decided the property to the Village of Central Square for perpetual care. The Village Board adopted the name Hillside Memorial Cemetery and Mayor Millard Murphy appointed Bruce Meldrim as Cemetery Commissioner.

All lots shall be held in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the State of New York and shall not be used for any other purpose than as a place for burial for the dead.

Vaults or tombs are not recommended, but will be permitted, with submittals and approval from the Village of Central Square Board of Trustees.

Proprietors shall not allow interments to be made upon their lots for compensation, nor shall any transfer or assignment of any lot, or any interest therein, be valid without the consent in writing, from the Village Board of Trustees; nor shall any disinterment be allowed, without permission being obtained from the Board of Trustees.

If any monument, vault, tomb, effigy or structure whatever or any inscription be placed on or upon any lot, which shall be determined by a majority of the Village Board or Trustees for the time being to be offensive or improper, or should fall in to disrepair, the said Board of Trustees shall have the right, and it shall be their duty, to delegate to the Commissioner of Cemeteries to enter upon such lot and remove the said offensive or improper item (§) and contact family when possible.

The foundations for the vaults, monuments or any other structure shall be in accordance with the rules of the cemetery, and all workmanship employed on such foundations, or in the construction of vaults, enclosing lots, erection of monuments or any other work pertaining to the improvement of the grounds, shall be under the supervision and direction of said Village or its agents. The grading and trenching of all lots, the digging of the graves, foundations, and trenches, must be under the direction of an employee of the Village.

Village of Central Square is responsible for the perpetual care of the Hillside Memorial Cemetery and Park. This includes upkeep and general maintenance of all current and future interment, including all common grounds, access roadways, the trees and shrubs (Planted by the village only) of the cemetery. Perpetual care does not include the maintenance, repair or replacement of grave markers nor the planting of flowers and ornamental plants on individual sites of interment, nor the maintenance of any special or unusual features associated with individual sites of interment. Furthermore, perpetual care does not include the repair or reconstruction, either partial or complete, of any marble, granite or other stonework, bronze or concrete artwork or any structure damaged or destroyed by action of the elements, Act of God, common enemy, thieves, vandals, malicious mischief makers, explosions, accidents, invasions, insurrections, riots or by the order of any military or civil authority, whether the damage by direct or collateral.

- In ground planting is prohibited.
- The Cemetery reserves the right to remove all potted flowers, potted shrubs, potted trees, wreaths or other decorations from lots as soon as they become unsightly.
- Glass and wire prohibited-Limit two (2) floral arrangements per grave.
- No monuments to be placed without permanent foundation.
- A base is required for all monuments.
- In the older section of the cemetery when a lot is purchased, a set of corner posts must be purchased through Hillside Memorial Cemetery or their monument maker before a deed is given.
- One full burial and one cremains burial per grave is permitted, or two (2) cremains burial per grave is permitted.
- All monuments, memorials or markers must be constructed of granite or bronze or marble.
- Interment of cremated remains must be in a receptacle of approved material.
